

In the wake of COVID-19, Trailblazer chapter effectively shut down and became inactive for several months. However, that changed when I and a few others from Troop 360 who went through our Ordeal in May of this year came together in August and started to meet at the Erlanger Branch of the Kenton County Library. For the first two chapter meetings held on the first Thursday of the month, there was no leadership barring input from our then-unofficial Chapter Advisor or any real agenda aside from growth and organization (though we did form a elections team and hosted an election for Troop 8 at the end of August). However, I became inspired to step up to the role of Chapter Chief after Fall Fellowship in September despite being new to the organization. At the same time, word got around Northern Kentucky that the chapter

at 6:00pm at the Durr Branch will be a Christmas party with pizza and a movie! In January, there will be a short business meeting followed by try-outs for roles in the Pre-Ordeal/Ordeal ceremonies. We will also possibly be changing the name of our chapter from Trailblazer to something else in the future (though this has been tabled as of the November meeting) and forming more elections teams to meet the anticipated demand for elections in the winter months leading up to the 2023 Ordeals. Overall, the future is shining brighter for Trailblazer chapter than it has in a long time, and we are excited for its arrival!

Raccoon (Ft. Ancient) Chapter:

This month the Raccoon Chapter will be doing community service by helping Five Rivers Metroparks with their program *History of BSA Camp Hook at Twin Creek MetroPark*. Formerly Dan Beard Council Boy Scout, Camp Hook.

On November 12th, we are also reopening the Thunderbird Trail at Twin Creek MetroPark. It was last operated by Ku-Ni-Eh Lodge in late 1980's. We will also be selling patches as a fundraiser for Chapter activities and to promote hiking to Scouting Units.

Winter Fellowship:


Winter Fellowship will be here before we know it, and we want your help planning it!
